

## **Annual Narrative Report**

August 1, 2023 – July 31, 2024

## Grant's overview

The Worldwide Education Fund of the Dallas Foundation provides the American University of Central Asia (AUCA) with grant funds for financial support to twelve promising and talented Tajik students who would not have had the opportunity to access high-quality university education under their current financial conditions. AUCA will ensure the students' inclusive and dynamic educational environment, self-development and capacity-building opportunities, and knowledge necessary for future success.

## **Progress to date**

Thanks to the generous support of the Donor, eleven students have successfully completed the 2023-24 AY, and one student took an academic leave from the fall of 2023 until the end of the academic year. The students have demonstrated excellent academic performance. The average cumulative GPA is 3.45. The highest results belong to Manizha Niyatbekova and Zaynab Nazirova.
