Grant's overview

The Worldwide Education Fund of the Dallas Foundation provides the American University of Central Asia (AUCA) with grant funds for financial support to 26 promising and talented Tajik students who would not have had the opportunity to access high-quality university education under their current financial conditions. AUCA will ensure the students' inclusive and dynamic educational environment, self-development and capacity-building opportunities, and knowledge necessary for future success.

Progress to date

Thanks to the generous support of the Donor, 25 students have successfully completed the 2024-25 AY, and one student was dismissed at the end of the Fall semester due to health problems. The students have demonstrated excellent academic performance. The average cumulative GPA is 3.15. The highest results belong to Manizha Niyatbekova and Zaynab Nazirova.

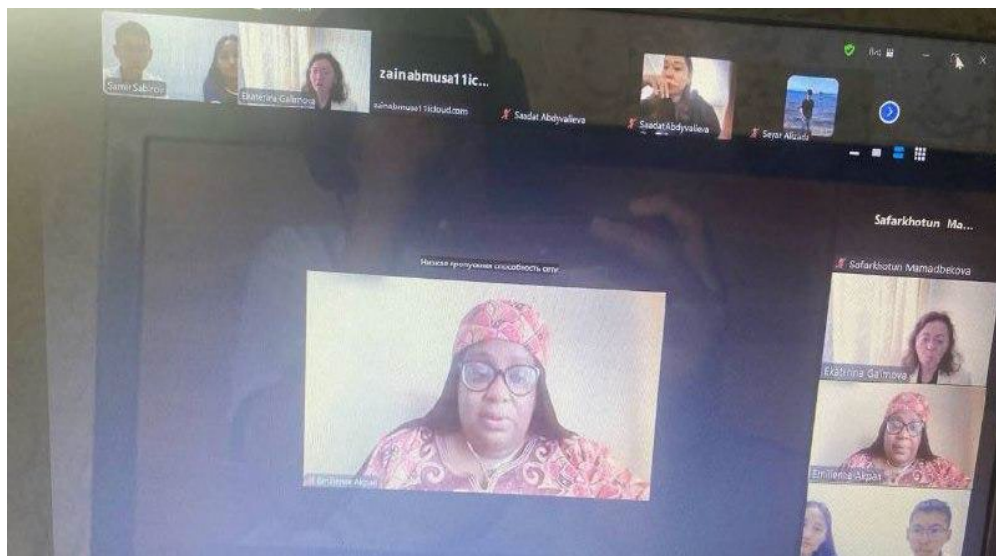
of involvement and curiosity. During the spring semester, Safarkhotun joined the Board

She improved her academic standing, raising her GPA to 3.8. Her engagement with ambassador talks during this semester also allowed her to apply theoretical knowledge to real-world contexts. As an intern at the ICP department, Rumiya contributed to the accreditation process by assisting her advisor with research and information gathering related to library and academic resources. She also represented her department at AUCA's Open House Day, where she interacted with prospective students and their families, provided translation support, and helped distribute departmental materials. This experience significantly enhanced her communication

continue tutoring and is actively applying to internship programs aligned with her major in international and comparative politics. She also intends to search for scholarships to support her future studies. Her goals for the upcoming academic year include further improving her academic portfolio, raising her GPA, and pursuing internships that align with her career aspirations in political research and policy development.

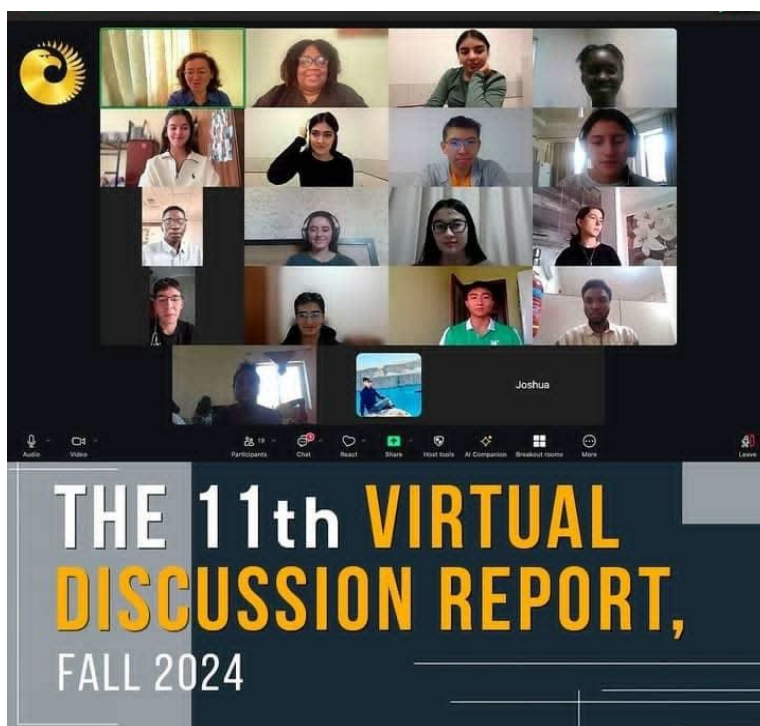

As part of a class project, Mutriba joined a group visit to Kant, where she and her classmates gave a presentation on copyright laws to local school students. By using real case studies, the group made the topic more engaging and accessible. This outreach experience demonstrated her ability to apply academic learning to real-world educational efforts. In addition to her academic work, she participated in a small but meaningful extracurricular initiative by helping organize a webinar for high school students in remote regions of Tajikistan. In the session, she introduced students to AUCA, shared admission-related information, and encouraged them to consider higher education opportunities. This experience was especially fulfilling, as it allowed her to give back to her community and help students take steps toward shaping their futures. This academic year, however, was not without its difficulties. Mutriba faced serious financial stress, particularly in managing tuition fees and living expenses. Coming from a family with limited financial resources, she experienced pressure that affected both her academic performance and emotional well-being. In addition to financial hardship, personal challenges earlier in the year made it difficult for her to stay fully focused and engaged. Despite these obstacles, she has shown strong determination to regain her balance and continue progressing. Looking ahead, Mutriba is actively searching for an in-person internship in the field of psychology to gain practical experience aligned with her major. She also plans to participate more actively in student life, focus on personal development, and continue working toward academic and emotional stability. Her commitment to growth and her willingness to overcome adversity reflect her perseverance and dedication to making the most of her time at AUCA.

During the 2024–2025 academic year, **Mashhur Arabshoev** continued to demonstrate strong commitment to both academic achievement and personal development. He successfully maintained high academic performance, earning a GPA of 3.9 in the fall semester and 3.6 in the spring semester. These difficulties made it hard for her to focus on her studies, resulting in lower academic performance in some of her courses. Nevertheless, she persevered through these obstacles with determination and resilience. Looking ahead, Manizha remains committed to her academic progress and community contributions. Her ability to balance a rigorous academic load with mentorship, volunteer work, and personal development initiatives highlights her discipline, empathy, and determination to grow into a socially responsible economist and leader.

She began experiencing severe anxiety, disrupted sleep, and physical symptoms such as hand tremors and seizures. With the support of professional therapists and psychologists,

In the face of these difficulties, Nekbakhtsulton has shown remarkable determination. She plans to seek online employment as an English teacher to help ease the financial strain on her family. Although she was selected to attend a summer camp in

Prague, financial constraints prevented her from participating. Nevertheless, she remains hopeful and continues to pursue similar opportunities. Looking ahead, she is excited about further exploring her creative side. She intends to write and publish a story on Wattpad — a platform she has long admired — and is considering founding an art club at AUCA in the next semester. After much reflection, Nekbakhtsulton has also decided to

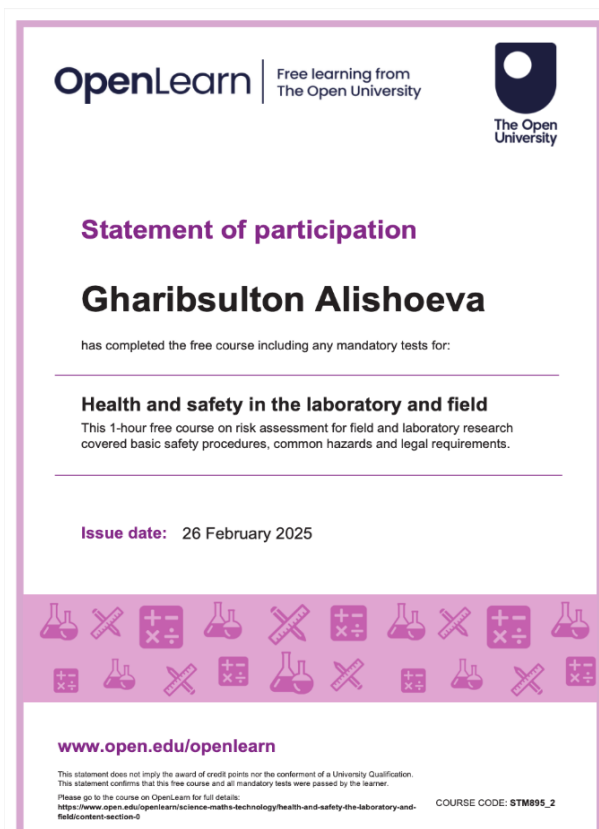
